On the last day, we were taken to Zedekiah's cave where we did a reading from Ezekiel 47. We saw a small trickle of water, which according to the prophecy in Ezekiel 47...

8 Then he said to me, "These waters go out toward the eastern region and go down into the Arabah; then they go toward the sea, being made to flow into the sea, and the waters of the sea become fresh.

Ron and Family.

The first time I met Ron, a Malaysian missionary in Philippines, and his wife, Sharon, they struck me as a couple who have had a simple lifestyle. Looking calm and composed, Ron began his address to the small group gathered in ETW office with a tragic story. He told of a young girl who had recently taken her own life simply because her parents could not afford her camp fee; she had come to her own conclusion that she may be a burden to her parents.

Such unexpected start startled me indeed! But this is a shocking truth that Singapore needs to wake up to. While our own economy seems to be slightly shaken by US sub-prime issue and global financial market, and locals feeling the pinch of increased inflation, our ASEAN neighbours have been enduring dire poverty for many years. Our Filipino brethren are no exception. To us, the slowdown in growth may mean only a trip to Europe downgraded to a trip to China but to them it may mean the inability to go college and therefore trapped in this vicious cycle of poverty.

Ron thanked Singapore for its generous monetary gifts to Philippines. Every small gift from us here sent heart-felt gratitude to the brethren there. There were many thanksgiving letters from students in Bukas Puso Scholarship Programme. I could almost hear a heave of relief as the financial burden on the Filipino churches eased. Not only have the monies helped the brethren, it has also strengthened their ministry to those outside the household of faith. This is very important as 'the only thing that prevents the growth of Palangoy Church is the need of monies', Cecelia noted sharply from her previous visits there. This quickly becomes apparent through Ron's reports.

The youths in Palangoy Church are passionate about following Christ and it manifests in their faithful commitments to study the Bible through Intentional Discipleship Scheme (IDS). At one meeting, you can have 70 plus youths congregating in a small room equipped only with fan. Smell of perspiration may fill the room yet it did not stop the youths from worshipping God. The leaders in Palangoy Church work very hard too, many of them holding a daytime job. Some of the leaders are even leading two cell groups. Such outpouring of their lives...

ETW Ministry Centre was officially dedicated to the Lord on 5 January 2008. What better way to start the new calendar year than to offer the new ministry centre to the Lord! The simple and cozy event on a Saturday afternoon was attended by more than 20 people comprising students, helpers, and attendees of the ministry's November study tour.



The new ministry centre at Jalan Sultan is central will enable the ministry to conduct classes off a single location. The space in the ministry centre can comfortably sit 75 students and also has ample space to display and store publications and media produced by the ministry.

Indeed God has wonderfully blessed this ministry through such the locale provision and we see Him working through us and using this ministry centre to further expound His Word and expand the boundaries of planting the Word.

The dedication session ended with songs of thanks and of course, some wonderful refreshments contributed by those in attendance!

THE
GENEALOGY OF
JESUS CHRIST

Most readers tend to skip genealogies whenever they encounter that particular section of Scripture. The same goes with the genealogy of our Lord Jesus Christ. While it is not my purpose to give an exhaustive dissertation on this topic, I would want to highlight certain important aspects of the Lord's genealogy. I believe that God did not put in genealogies without good reasons and as such, it is our responsibility to discover His reasons for doing so.

1. The Importance of Genealogy

Genealogies are important because they not only tell us not only who the ancestors are, but also for inheritance sake. The land of Israel is allotted to the 12 tribes, which can be traded or developed depending on the family's choice. However, in the year of Jubilee, the land will revert to its original owners and as such, it is critical that one be able to trace one's own ancestry. Those not able to do so will be left without land and could possibly be treated as foreigners.

2. The Gospels' Approach to Jesus' Genealogy

The gospels approach the Jesus' genealogy depending on the aspect of the Lord they wish to emphasize.

Matthew's gospel was written to the Jews with emphasis on the kingly and Jewish aspect of Jesus and as such, he had important figures such as Abraham and David in his genealogy.

Matthew 1:1 The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

Part 1 - When doubts assail you, when trials encompass you, when failure plagues you, when you're weary of running the race, there is only one answer! It is found in drawing near to the throne of grace, to Jesus your High Priest who can be touched with the feelings of your infirmities.


This study on Hebrews 1–4 will look at the Son, at angels, and at our great salvation. We will see what God has spoken through our merciful and faithful high priest, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Part 2 - The study on Hebrews 5-8 will lead you into an intimacy with our Lord Jesus Christ, an intimacy that will hold you in the worst of all circumstances. If these truths can hold the believers who are facing certain martyrdom, surely they can hold us who have lesser problems than they!

Part 3 - We've been in Hebrews from Chapters 1-8 and your heart must have been enthralled with the beauty of the Lord and so humbled by His great love with which He loved us. Truly, the Lord Jesus Christ is our Great High Priest and we must consider Him if we are to be able to live as more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

In this final study of Hebrews, we will be looking at the superior sacrifice and superior benefits our Lord has won for us and learn to live in the light of these truths. This is the only way to endure the persecutions and troubles and distresses that colour our world today.






The book of Daniel is one of the more fascinating books of the Bible which is more easily read than, say, the book of Isaiah. It's not without purpose that God has woven the foundational principles of how to live in difficult times into the lives of Daniel and his three friends, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah. He wants us to *know* exactly how to behave when difficult times come.

Not only that, Daniel is the "spine" of Biblical prophecy and as such is essential to any understanding of the End times, the structure of prophecy and is key to the entire Old Testament revelation. God, in the book of Daniel, has given us His Plan for the Ages so that His people *can* know what will happen *before* it happens.

Cost: S\$18

In studying prophetic literature, especially with reference to the End Times, it is always essential to begin with the book of Daniel, for this particular book alone gives us chronological timelines which enable us to place the many prophesied events in the Bible in a linear fashion. That is the major reason why the book of Daniel is often called "the spine of Biblical prophecy". Thus it is foundational to any study of the End Times.

Our Lord Jesus warned us of deception practiced by false Christs and false prophets (see Matthew 24:4-5,11,24; Mark 13:5,22; Luke 21:8) and the Apostle Paul says, "But the Spirit explicitly says that in later times some will fall away from the faith, paying attention to deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons" (1 Timothy 4:1). There are yet many more warnings in the Bible about being deceived in the last days.

The only way to deal with false teachings is to give them the truth (see John 8:32). Thus there is a need to be very clear what the Bible actually says about the End Times and studying the book of Daniel will lay an accurate Biblical foundation on which to build all the other truths that are to be found in the various books of the Bible.

Mark's gospel emphasized the servanthood of Jesus. Slaves have no genealogies and as such none was mentioned.

Luke's gospel emphasized the humanity of Jesus and so he traces Jesus' genealogy all the way to Adam, the first man.

Luke 3:38 38 the son of Enosh, the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.

John was particularly interested in emphasizing the divinity of the Lord Jesus. As God has no beginning or end, so there is no genealogy mentioned in John's gospel.

3 Matthew's Account


Matthew 1:1-17 records for us the genealogy of Jesus through Joseph while Luke 3:23-38 records the genealogy of Jesus through Mary (according to the Jerusalem Talmud, Haggigah, Book 77, 4).

Matthew's gospel was written primarily to a Jewish audience, presenting Jesus as the King of the Jews. Tracing Jesus' genealogy to Abraham emphasized his Hebrew roots while tracing his genealogy to David proved that He was an heir to the Davidic throne.

Matthew divides the genealogy into 3 groups of 14 generations, separated by important time periods.

Matthew's genealogy was abridged because he omitted certain names that appeared in the Old Testament. The reason is 2-fold:

- 1. To aid in memorization of the genealogy. This aspect can be seen even in the bar-Mitzvah where 12 year old Jews celebrate their coming of age through memorizing the Torah. In addition, scrolls were scarce and expensive during New Testament times, so memorization was the norm.
- 2. To emphasize the Davidic character of the Lord Jesus Christ. In Gematria, the characters of the alphabets [7] (David) add up to 14, so Matthew is stressing the fact that Jesus is of David, David, David....

4. Luke's Account

Luke's gospel was directed to a mainly Gentile / Greek audience. And since Greeks are not so concerned about the fulfillment of Jewish prophecy, there was no particular emphasis on Jesus being the descendent of David.

Luke 1:1-4 ... it seemed fitting for me as well, having investigated everything carefully from the beginning, to write it out for you in consecutive order, most excellent Theophilus; 4 so that you might know the exact truth about the things you have been taught.

As mentioned, the genealogies in Matthew and Luke's account are different because Mathew traces Jesus' ancestry through Joseph while Luke traces it through Mary.

5. The Curse of Jehoiakim

Jeremiah 36:1-32 mentions the circumstances surrounding a curse on the descendents of Jehoiakim. Because he provoked God by burning a scroll on which the word of God was written (through Jeremiah), God pronounced a curse on Jehoiakim.

Jeremiah 36:30 'Therefore thus says the LORD concerning Jehoiakim king of Judah, "He shall have no one to sit on the throne of David,

Such a curse presents a difficulty since Jehoiakim, it seems, was an ancestor of the Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore God came up with a solution to solve this problem, i.e. the virgin birth.

Joseph (through which Jehoiakim was mentioned) was the legal father of the Lord Jesus but not His biological father. As such, the curse does not apply to Him since He was not born of Joseph. However, Jesus was the biological descendent of David through Mary (via Nathan, one of David's other son). He could still lay claim to David's throne.

Thus, through the virgin birth, Jesus could lay claim to both the legal and biological claim to the throne of David. The brilliance of God!
